The Sachse Historical Museum has received a donation of funds to begin immediate construction of improvements to the museum site. The donation is in honor of Jasper Newton "Nate" Sachse (1872-1952), a son of William Sachse

Blueprints have been drawn for the improvements, and can be seen at the museum at 3033 6th Street. It is expected that construction will be completed in time for the 2005 Annual Meeting of the Sachse Historical Society.
